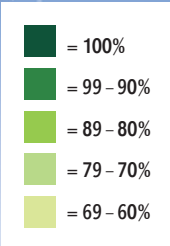
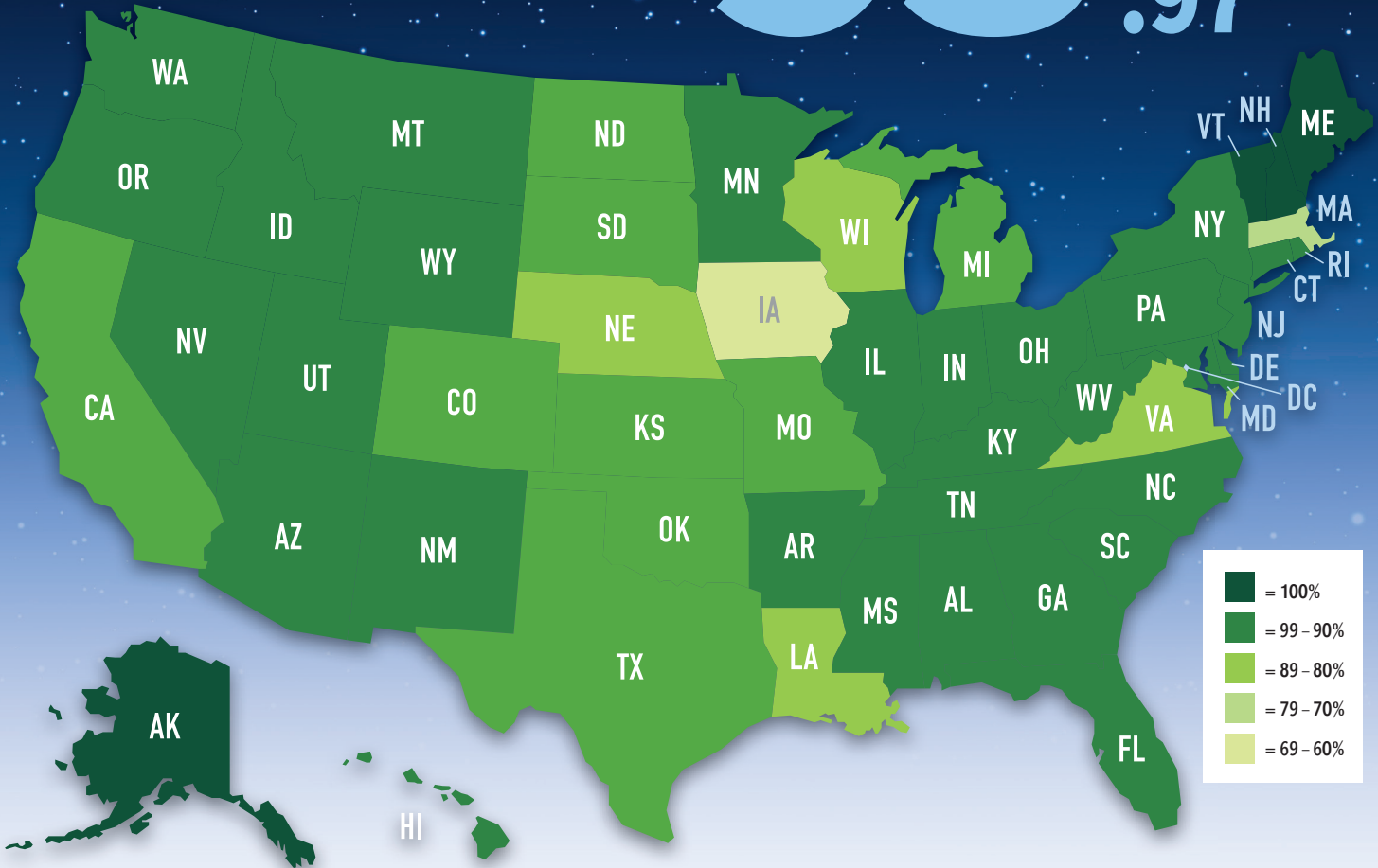


HOW MANY OF OUR U.S. ROADS ARE PAVED WITH ASPHALT?

* Percentages are derived from the Asphalt Institute Pavement Type Tracking Report for the year 2016 using the U.S. Federal Highways Administration's *Highway Statistics Report*. The numbers reflected show the percentage of in-service rural and urban pavements surfaced with a bituminous (asphalt) material for each state in 2016. Unpaved surfaces and asphalt surfaces that are less than 1" thick (such as bituminous surface treatments over gravel bases) were not considered in the analysis. The FHWA report compiles the number of centerline miles by pavement surface type.
